INTRODUCTION

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Who's ready for MORE Disney Cruise fun?! The NEW **Disney Destiny** ship set sail for the first time on November 20th, 2025.

The Destiny has been offering **4- and 5-night cruises to The Bahamas and Western Caribbean** during the inaugural season, with voyages stopping at one or both of Disney Cruise Line's island destinations – Castaway Cay and Lookout Cay at Lighthouse Point.

For Summer 2026, the Destiny will offer 3- to 7-night cruises to The Bahamas as well as the Eastern and Western Caribbean.

Aboard the Disney Destiny, you must choose a side: Heroes or Villains. According to Disney, the

Destiny's theme is "inspired by the dynamic duality of every great Disney story... where opposing forces of light and dark drive characters to rise to their purpose." Look out for both heroes and villains onboard the ship, including characters from ***The Lion King, One Hundred and One Dalmatians, and Hercules.***

Warning: The Wish, Treasure, and now the Destiny have a different ship layout and flow compared to Disney's older ships. So if you're used to traveling with the more classic DCL designs, these layouts can feel a little more broken up/harder to navigate.

RESTAURANTS OVERVIEW

Get ready for plenty of unique dining experiences aboard the Disney Destiny.

Three restaurants on this ship are part of **Disney Cruise Line's signature Rotational Dining** – you get to enjoy dinner at each of these spots during your sailing, and the wonderful servers rotate with you so they get to know your group and dining preferences.

On some of the Destiny's longer itineraries, you may get multiple experiences at certain restaurants. So some restaurants may offer different shows each night to make your experience unique.

The rotational dining restaurant options include:

- **Pride Lands: Feast of The Lion King** - a theatrical dining experience
- **Worlds of Marvel** - starring Groot and Rocket Raccoon
- **1923** - a journey through animation

But that's not all! You'll also find a Pirates of the Caribbean-themed lounge, the Haunted Mansion Parlor, Cruella De Vil's piano lounge, and the first-ever lounge inspired by Doctor Strange and his mystical arts.

Additionally, you can enjoy some casual dining spots, like a food hall and sweets shop. AND there are some adults-only restaurants aboard the ship, too.



PRIDE LANDS: FEAST OF THE LION KING

The Lion King roars into the Disney Cruise Line dining scene with Pride Lands: Feast of The Lion King! During this unique dining experience, 2 wise elders tell the story of Simba from cub to king, with family being the through line of the show.

Inside, the African savanna comes to life through lighting and immersive special effects. The windows shift from sunrise to sunset as you dine. The centerpiece is a set of tiered risers designed like African drums, setting the stage for a meal full of entertainment.

As you dine, a cast of live musicians and storytellers fills the room with performances straight out of the Pride Lands.

Expect to hear renditions of:

- “Circle of Life” and “Hakuna Matata,” – of course!
- A mash-up of “I Just Can’t Wait to Be King” and “Be Prepared,” highlighting the hero vs. villain showdown that defines the story.
- An instrumental version of “Can You Feel the Love Tonight” accompanied by an interpretive dance.
- And, “He Lives in You,” from both the sequel film and the Broadway production.

All this while you feast on themed cuisine with African flavors. It’s music, magic, and mealtime in one unforgettable experience.

ROTATIONAL DINING

WORLDS OF MARVEL

The Worlds of Marvel dining experience, which appears on several Disney Cruise Line Ships, is also available on the Destiny.

Here, your dinner comes with a side of chaos courtesy of Baby Groot. The storyline follows our favorite tiny tree as he tries (and mildly fails) to throw a surprise party for Rocket Raccoon.

You'll jam out to an "Awesome Mix" of tunes, test your Marvel knowledge with trivia, and try not to drop your fork when things on the screens get a little...*explosive*. It's dinner and a show (conducted mostly via screens) – superhero-style.

On some sailings, guests might also get to experience Avengers: Quantum Encounter, the same action-packed dinner show from the Disney Wish – where Ant-Man and The Wasp need your help to save the day. There's a familiar villain, plenty of gadgets, and maybe a few quantum-sized surprises along the way.

As for the food, you'll find dishes that are inspired by destinations within the Marvel Cinematic Universe – with flavors from around the globe and eats that nod to Wakanda, Sokovia, New York, and beyond.

ROTATIONAL DINING

1923

The final option on your rotational dining lineup is 1923 – Disney’s love letter to old-school Hollywood glamour. You’ll find this spot on the Wish and the Treasure too.

The restaurant serves up fresh California-inspired cuisine in a setting that feels equal parts movie premiere and museum exhibit.

Each dining room honors one of the Disney brothers – you’ll be seated in either the Walt room or Roy room – and both are packed with treasures from Disney’s animation vault. Think: sketches, props, concept art, and all the tools that turned a tiny animation studio into a full-blown empire. It’s classy and nostalgic.

Throughout 1923, you’ll spot displays packed with artwork, storyboards, and other behind-the-scenes treasures – this time highlighting the heroes and villains from Disney’s classic films.

It’s elegant, polished, and a much quieter experience than the high-energy situation at Worlds of Marvel and the musical entertainment at Pride Lands.

The menu leans into California’s cultural melting pot, blending Asian, European, and South American influences into dishes that feel fresh and refined. The drink list is just as thoughtfully curated – with wines straight from Napa Valley ready to make your inner sommelier (or casual sipper) very happy.

LOUNGES



If you're a diehard Disney Parks fan who hasn't previously considered a Disney Cruise...well, you may be tempted to book a cruise after learning about some of the themes of the **lounges on the Disney Destiny!**

CASK AND CANNON

Hoist yer colors, mateys – because the Disney Destiny just dropped anchor with a new watering hole: Cask and Cannon, a Pirates of the Caribbean-themed lounge.

This spot is inspired by the scenes and characters from the iconic Pirates of the Caribbean rides in Disney parks around the world. It's packed with **hidden details** to search for, so keep those eyes open! You'll even want to look at the carpet, which has details like rope, kraken tentacles, and Jack Sparrow's compass pointing to...the bar, of course! In terms of other decor, look for rum bottles, jail cell keys, and other "liberated" treasures from the crew's global escapades.

You can kick back here to watch your favorite game, sip on rare or specialty rums, and even sample "bootlegged brews" crafted just for this lounge and poured straight from the barrel.

LOUNGES



HAUNTED MANSION PARLOR

After first materializing on the Disney Treasure, the Haunted Mansion Parlor has re-materialized aboard the Disney Destiny – and it's every bit as gloriously ghoulish as it sounds.

This eerie yet elegant (*eerigant, if you will*) lounge is inspired by the classic Haunted Mansion attraction, complete with nods to its most mischievous spirits and a backstory centered on a mysteriously doomed ship captain. Pull up a chair and sip your way through a lineup of hauntingly good cocktails, beers, wines, and mocktails.

Keep your eyes peeled for a few familiar ghostly faces peeking out from the shadows – especially that bar mirror, which may or may not be watching you back.

And don't leave the ship without browsing the exclusive Haunted Mansion Parlor merch – perfect for anyone who wants to take a little afterlife ambiance home.

LOUNGES



DE VIL'S PIANO LOUNGE

Cruella De Vil finally has the glamorous lair she's always deserved – and honestly, we're shocked it took this long! De Vil's Piano Lounge is every bit as over-the-top as you'd expect from Disney's most fashionable villain. This spot blends inspiration from the original *One Hundred and One Dalmatians* animated classic and the 2021 live-action film.

Inside, you'll find velvet, sparkle, and just the right amount of menace. There's even a Dalmatian-spotted piano ready to fill the room with sultry tunes while you sip on martinis, chic cocktails, or a glass of bubbly that would make Cruella proud.

One side of the lounge opens to the Grand Hall – great for people-watching.

OH! And keep an eye out for the legendary Cruella herself! She may just pop in to grace you with her presence and **INSIST** that you write a new song for her, considering the rather unflattering lyrics of the existing song attached to her. It's a fantastic little experience.

LOUNGES



THE SANCTUM

Introducing **The Sanctum** – Disney Cruise Line’s first-ever lounge inspired by Doctor Strange and all his mystical, reality-bending chaos.

Centrally located on the ship (because obviously the Sorcerer Supreme would want to keep an eye on everything), this spot is filled with “mystical artifacts” and décor.

You’ll find alcoholic drinks, mocktails, coffee, cocktails, and wine. Look out for some tableside performances by “mixology sorcerers.” You’ll also find a VERY limited snack menu.

And don’t miss the circular mirror behind the bar – a clever nod to the Sanctum Sanctorum’s iconic window. Just don’t stare too long...you might find yourself in another dimension (or worse, ordering another round).

The Mystic Waffles at The Sanctum are a nice treat if you’re nearby and don’t mind paying extra. The berry version was fine, but we’d recommend the custard over the berry 100 times over.

CASUAL DINING



MARCELINE MARKET

Marceline Market – named after Walt Disney’s hometown of Marceline, Missouri – is the Destiny’s buffet option. You’ll also find this food hall on the Wish and Treasure.

Inside, you’ll wander through a lineup of themed food stations (or “markets”) inspired by global marketplaces.

Breakfast and lunch bring everything from classic comfort food to plant-based options and international bites that’ll make you want to grab one of everything. There are ten counters. Endless temptation.

There’s also a café-style beverage bar, plus indoor and outdoor seating, so you can eat your Mickey waffles with a side of ocean breeze.

Did someone say **bottomless POG juice refills**? Don’t skip the drink stations – soda, water, and other basics are self-serve and free-flowing, making this a prime pit stop for hydration...or at least your third Diet Coke of the morning.

CASUAL DINING



MICKEY & FRIENDS FESTIVAL OF FOODS

If you're craving something quick (and preferably served with a side of sea breeze), head to the upper decks for **Mickey & Friends Festival of Foods** – the Destiny's open-air dining spot that feels like a seaside boardwalk straight out of The Wonderful World of Mickey Mouse shorts.

You'll find character-themed food stalls dishing out all the essentials: smoky BBQ at **Mickey's Smokestack**, gooey slices at **Daisy's Pizza Pies**, burgers and chicken tenders at **Goofy's Grill**, sweet treats at **Minnie's Delights**, and tacos that Donald himself would probably fight you for at **Donald's Cantina**.

It's a fast and fun way to get a meal or snack. Just grab a shaded table nearby, kick back, and prepare to question how something called "Festival of Foods" can make you this emotionally attached to cruise ship food.

CAFES & SWEET SHOPS



CAFÉ MEGARA

Need a caffeine fix worthy of the gods? Swing by **Café Megara**, located just off the Grand Hall, for your daily dose of espresso-fueled heroism.

Inspired by *Disney's Hercules*, this spot oozes “Greco disco” vibes – think Mount Olympus meets 1970s nightclub. There are all kinds of details to look for here, so take a minute to really look around.

On the menu, you'll find freshly made juices, coffee, tea, cocktails, and specialty drinks.

A quick heads-up: cafés and sweet shops on Disney Cruise Line are considered premium spots, which means your latte art and chocolate mousse aren't included in your cruise fare.

CAFES & SWEET SHOPS



CAFÉ MERIDA

Café Merida is a grab-and-go spot just off the Grand Hall. This is a cozy little corner inspired by everyone's favorite fiery-haired heroine from *Brave*. There are Celtic-inspired designs with nods to Scottish landscapes and motifs from the film woven throughout.

Stop by for coffee, tea, or whatever magic potion keeps you from turning into a bear. It's a quiet, charming nook – perfect for fueling up throughout the day.

EDNA À LA MODE SWEETS

In the mood for something fabulous and sugar-loaded, darling? Swing by **Edna À La Mode Sweets**, the dessert boutique inspired by *The Incredibles*' most iconic fashion designer (and yes, she'd absolutely judge your outfit while handing you a cookie).

Based on the short film *Auntie Edna*, this confectionery reimagines her sewing studio as a dessert lab. The shop is decked out in colorful bolts of fabric, costume displays, and sculptures of Edna and Jack-Jack.

Handmade gelato, ice cream, cookies, candies, and other stylishly sweet creations are all served with flair. [You can even get a Signature Sundae with a collectible car!](#)

Just be aware that this is considered a more premium option, and snacks here are NOT included in your cruise fare.

ADULT-EXCLUSIVE DINING



There are three adult-exclusive dining spots onboard the Disney Destiny – and just like on the Wish and Treasure, they're all inspired by *Beauty and the Beast*.

THE ROSE

First up: **The Rose** – a swanky lounge perfect for a pre-dinner cocktail or a post-meal nightcap.



This space serves as the entryway to **Palo Steakhouse** and **Enchanté**, but it's worth lingering here for the atmosphere alone. There's plush seating, glimmering details straight out of the Beast's castle, and, of course, the enchanted rose itself makes a cameo.

The menu features high-end wines, top-shelf liquors, and a selection of elevated small plates – ideal for when you want to feel fancy but not commit to a full entrée.



In short: it's classy, it's cinematic, and it's your cue to order champagne and pretend you're dining in a fairytale.



These experiences come with an extra charge and aren't included in your cruise fare. Some of them can be tough to snag (at least traditionally), so if you've got your heart set on one of these spots – aside from The Rose – be sure to book early!

ADULT-EXCLUSIVE DINING



PALO STEAKHOUSE

Palo Steakhouse takes its cue from the ever-dignified Cogsworth. You'll find this spot on the Wish and Treasure as well.

The design here blends warm elegance with subtle nods to clockwork details – gears, metallic accents, and rich textures that give the space a refined, old-world feel (plus, those panoramic ocean views don't hurt).

The dinner menu that merges Italian cuisine with premium steaks – think Kobe, Wagyu, and everything in between.

Expect an impressive lineup of Italian wines, craft beers, and the legendary Palo chocolate soufflé, made fresh to order and absolutely worth planning your whole meal around.

Dinner here is an upscale affair, so pack accordingly. Formal or semi-formal attire is recommended, but “dress-casual attire with a polished look” (like dress pants or jeans in good condition) is okay too.

Brunch is also offered at Palo Steakhouse on most sea days. This is a slightly more casual affair, so dress shorts are okay. But t-shirts, swimwear, and sports clothing are not allowed.

ADULT-EXCLUSIVE DINING



ENCHANTÉ

Rounding out the trio of adult-exclusive dining experiences is **Enchanté** – the most elegant restaurant aboard the Disney Destiny and a tribute to everyone’s favorite charming candelabra, Lumière.

Also found on the Disney Wish and Treasure, Enchanté is pure luxury at sea. The menu is crafted by **three-Michelin-starred Chef Arnaud Lallement**, so yes – this is the spot where you might order something you’re unfamiliar with and have it completely blow you away. Expect global ingredients, artful plating, and flavors so refined they’ll make you forget you’re on a ship with a waterslide.

You can visit for dinner or opt for a prix-fixe or à la carte lunch. Either way, you get to bask in the *Beauty and the Beast*-inspired ambiance – complete with soft candlelight and shimmering metallic touches.

This is as fancy as it gets, so leave the flip-flops behind. Formal or semi-formal attire is the move here, though polished dress-casual is generally okay as well (think dress pants, jeans that are in good condition, and dressy tops). No t-shirts, swimwear, or sports attire.



STATEROOMS



Now let's talk about your *personal* oasis aboard the Disney Destiny – your stateroom!

Each of the ship's 1,256 rooms features custom artwork celebrating the journeys of some famous Disney legends, so you can fall asleep surrounded by a little extra magic.

All rooms are designed with families in mind, which means you'll find Disney Cruise Line's brilliant split-bath setup – a total game-changer when you're trying to get multiple people ready without sparking a full-scale bathroom war. Many rooms also connect, so you can expand your space or keep the whole crew nearby.

You can choose from **Inside Staterooms** (cozy and window-free), **Oceanview Staterooms** (hello, porthole!), **Verandah Staterooms** (private balcony), or go all out with a **Concierge-level Stateroom**, which comes with access to a private lounge and sundeck (and much more).

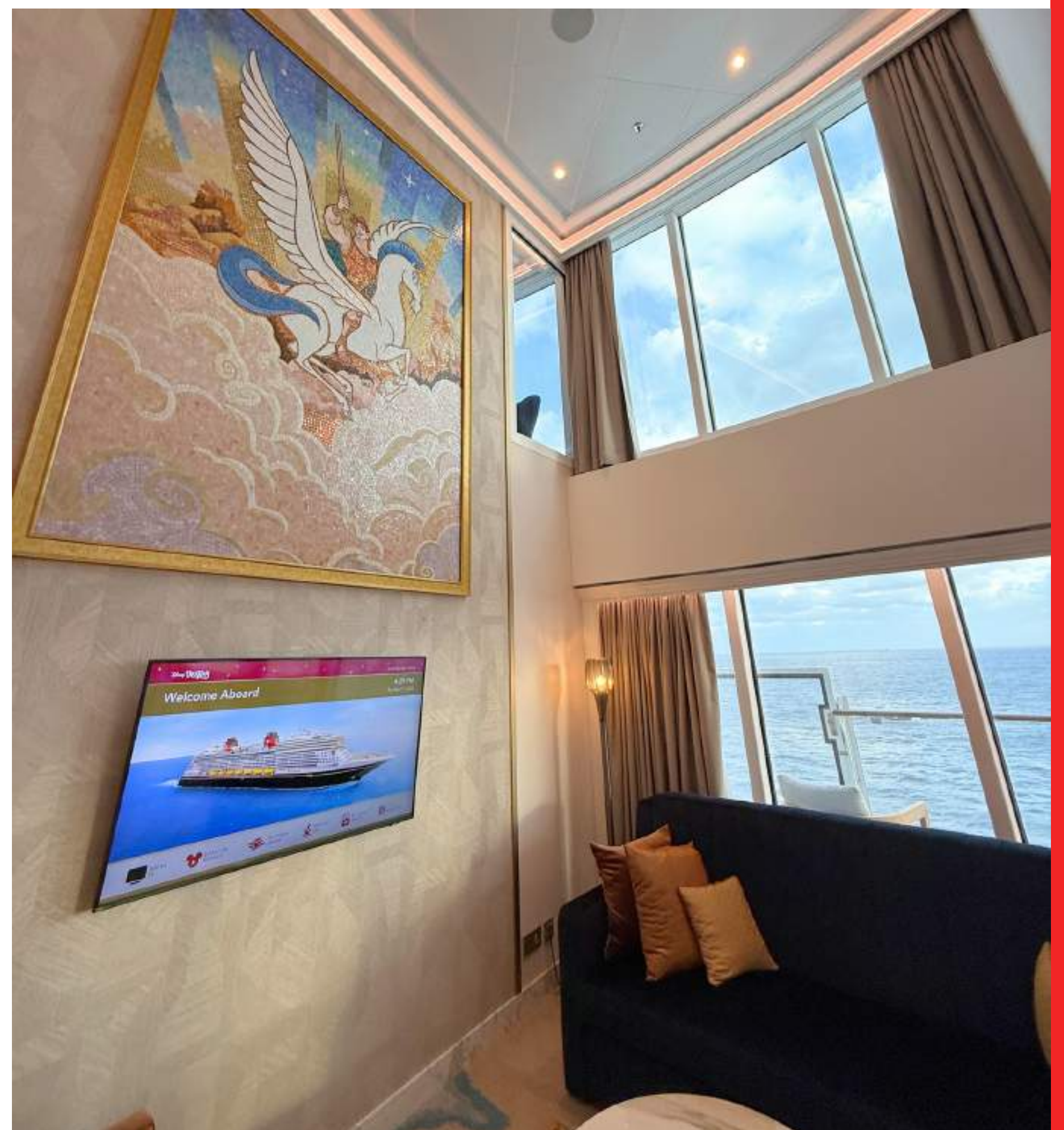
SUITES

ROYAL SUITES

The Disney Destiny goes above and beyond with its **Royal Concierge Suites**. These ultra-luxurious spaces are themed after Hercules and The Incredibles.

The **Hero Suites** channel all the strength of Hercules, featuring Greco-Roman architecture and bold patterns.

Over in the **IncrediSuites**, it's all sleek lines and mid-century modern vibes – a perfect tribute to everyone's favorite superfamily. It's stylish, it's swanky, and it's so impeccably cool that even Edna Mode would approve (no capes, though... obviously).



There are 1-Story Royal Suites or 2-Story Royal Suites. Both sleep up to 6 guests.

The Royal Suites also generally feature:

- 2 main bedrooms
- 3 full bathrooms
- Private balcony with a whirlpool tub
- Large living area
- Open dining salon
- Pantry and wet bar stocked with water and sodas
- Walk-in closet in both main bedrooms

SUITES

DESTINY TOWER SUITE

The **Disney Destiny** is home to an extra special suite called the **Destiny Tower Suite**.

This one-of-a-kind penthouse is inspired by Iron Man's legacy and over-the-top lifestyle, blending a sleek mechanical design with soft, luxurious touches.

Perched high inside the ship's forward funnel, it offers jaw-dropping, two-story views of the top deck and the ocean beyond – basically, your own floating Stark Tower.

Clocking in at 1,966 square feet, this suite sleeps eight guests. Inside, you'll find separate areas for dining, lounging, and napping off your superhuman adventures – plus a full kitchen and a private elevator!

The space includes two main bedrooms, a kids' room, a library that doubles as another bedroom, 4.5 bathrooms, a two-story living area, a grand spiral staircase, an open dining salon, and a pantry and wet bar stocked with sodas and water.

In short: it's less "cruise ship cabin" and more "floating billionaire hideout."

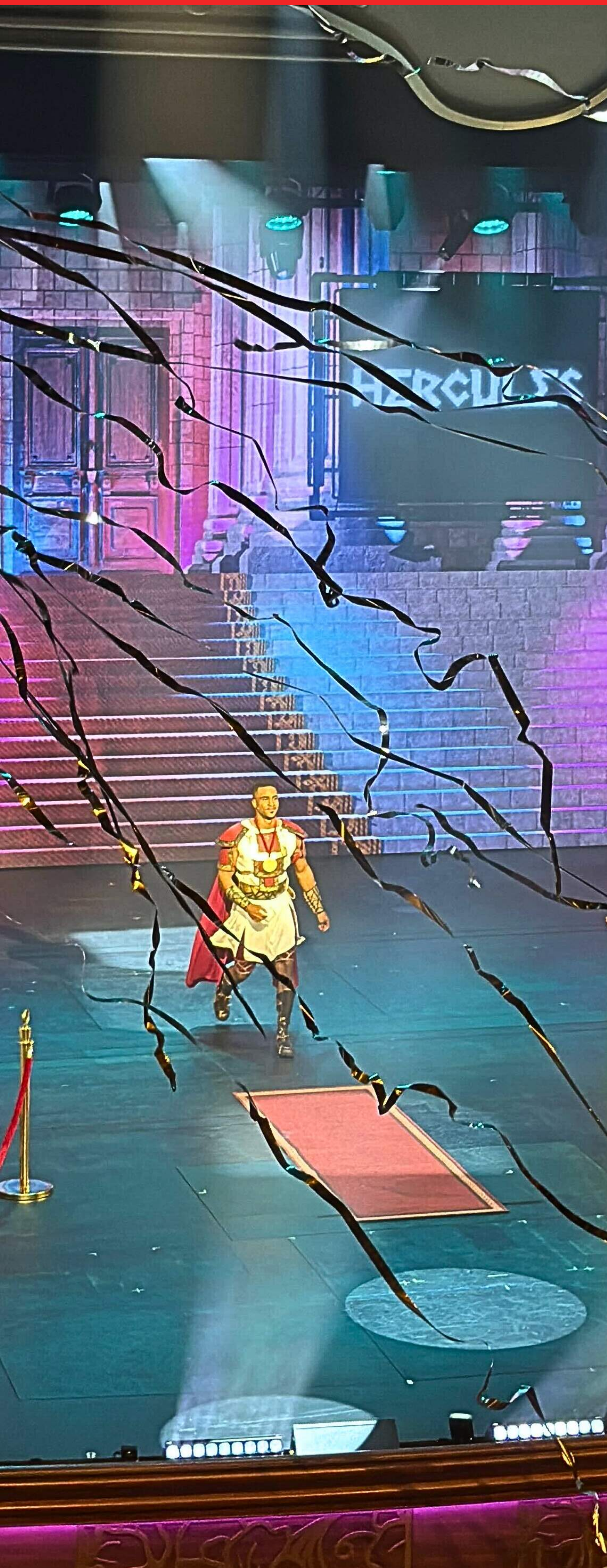

ENTERTAINMENT



As with every Disney Cruise Line ship, the **Disney Destiny** isn't about to let you get bored – not for a single sea day. Entertainment is a big deal, and we were truly blown away by some of the offerings here.

At the heart of it all is the **Walt Disney Theatre**, home to exclusive, full-scale productions. Onboard, you'll get to see fan favorites from other Disney Cruise Line ships, like **Frozen: A Musical Spectacular** and **Disney Seas the Adventure**. Both of those shows are packed with the kind of show-stopping moments that'll have you humming "Let It Go" in the buffet line.

But the headliner on this ship is a brand-NEW production of **Disney's Hercules**, created just for the Destiny. It's a more contemporary retelling of the classic animated story. There are larger-than-life characters, and reimagined versions of the beloved songs from the film with an even bolder pop and gospel flair. This show truly blew us away. It's one you will NOT want to miss.

For more entertainment, head to the **Grand Hall**. Here, you'll find live music, character encounters, and more unique Disney moments that'll make you forget you're technically in the middle of the ocean.

Throughout your sailing, keep an eye out for everyone from **Loki** and **Cruella De Vil** to **Maleficent**, **Black Panther**, and **Spider-Man**.

For a more hidden encounter, ask a Cast Member to help you find **Dr. Facilier's Parlor** – it's kinda hard to find but is on Deck 5. This was a really unique and interactive meet done in small groups.

Catch first-run movies in the **Wonderland** and **Never Land Cinemas**. Or you can head to **Saga**, a two-story venue just off the Grand Hall that hosts family activities by day and adults-only entertainment by night. (It's subtly inspired by Wakandan architecture.)

At **Hero Zone**, you'll step into a sports and recreation space where you can tackle physical challenges and game-show-style competitions that'll either bond your family forever or ruin game night for life.

For more fun, check out the **Oogie Boogie dance party**, look for an interactive **trivia event that may get interrupted by some villains**, and stop by the **Pirate's Rockin' Parlay Party**, where fireworks light up the sky.



Don't miss the Maleficent encounter in Saga. It has some interactive elements and even a photo-op.



The Disney Wish made waves (literally) as the first ship to debut a Disney attraction at sea – the **AquaMouse** – and now the Disney Destiny is cranking things up a notch with its very own **exclusive storyline!**

The AquaMouse is a 760-foot-long water ride that blends coaster thrills with animated chaos. Each ship in the Wish Class features its own custom short, and on the Destiny, it's all about "Sing a Silly Song." Join Mickey and Minnie as they journey to the top of **Villain Mountain**, where they run into the Queen of Hearts, Chernabog, and Scar. But don't worry – a silly song (and a sprinkle of pixie dust) turns every terrifying moment into something hilariously off-the-rails.

Beyond the AquaMouse, the upper decks are basically paradise for water lovers. There are **ten pools**, splash zones, casual dining spots, and plenty of sunny corners to lounge around.

Little ones can dive into the **Toy Story Splash Zone**. And the family can enjoy the **Slide-a-saurus Rex side**. And you can even stop by a smoothie bar.

Meanwhile, grown-ups can slip away to **Quiet Cove**, the adults-only retreat "dedicated to lounging, sipping, and soaking." Here, you'll find an infinity pool, bar, and poolside lounge.



Hit up the Aqua Mouse early to avoid crowds – like on day one when everyone else is at the lunch buffet or at least earlier in the day. You'll find this ride will have long waits during the afternoons and especially on sea days.

RELAXATION, FITNESS, & PAMPERING



If your vacation goals lean more toward spa robes and serenity than pirate parties and pool slides, make a beeline for **Senses Spa**.

Here, you can indulge in everything from massages and facials to full-on pampering sessions in private treatment rooms or spa suites. Steam rooms, aromatherapy lounges, and other bliss-inducing amenities make this the ultimate place to forget you have responsibilities on land.



Feeling a little more *sweat* than serenity? Head next door to **Senses Fitness**, where you can exercise with a view of the sea.

For a sharp dose of style, pop into **Hook's Barbery** – a men's salon inspired by Captain Hook. You can get classic cuts, straight-razor shaves, and skincare services here. Oh, and there's a hidden bar tucked inside – be sure to ask about it!

And for those who prefer their pampering with a bit of princess energy, **Untangled Salon** (inspired by Tangled) offers haircuts, manicures, pedicures, styling, teeth whitening, and skin treatments. It's the perfect spot to let your hair down – or, you know, have someone spruce it up after a few too many pool days!



KIDS & TEENS CLUBS

Disney offers up plenty of spaces for its younger voyagers too (in fact, the adults might be VERY jealous of just how incredibly detailed and fun these spots are!). Here's what kiddos and teens can enjoy on the Destiny.

DISNEY'S OCEANEER CLUB (AGES 3-10)

Kids get their own slice of adventure at the **Oceaneer Club**, where Disney-trained counselors lead the fun and imagination runs wild.

First up: the **Marvel Super Hero Academy**, where little heroes-in-training can suit up and learn the ropes from Spider-Man, Black Panther, Ant-Man, and the Wasp. There's high-tech fun, interactive missions, and enough "saving the day" to tucker them out.

Then there's **Fairytale Hall**, a series of charming activity rooms celebrating Disney royalty – and a few of those royal pals might just drop by in person. Kids can unleash their creativity in **Rapunzel's Art Studio**, dive into storytime and role-play in **Belle's Library**, or channel their inner Elsa in Anna and **Elsa's Sommerhus**, complete with opportunities to create their very own "ice magic."





Over in **Star Wars: Cargo Bay**, kids can become creature handlers and help care for a few familiar faces from a galaxy far, far away. We're talking Porgs, Loth-Cats, and even a Dianoga. (Yes, the creature from the trash compactor!)

Next up is the **Walt Disney Imagineering Lab**, where kids get to peek behind the curtain and uncover the secrets of Disney's creative masterminds. Through hands-on experiments and design challenges, they'll discover what it takes to dream up the rides, lands, and worlds we all love.

Designed for the littler cruisers, **Mickey and Minnie Captain's Deck** is a nautical-themed play zone packed with sensory games, slides, and ship wheels galore. It's sort-of like a kid-sized cruise ship within the cruise ship! And if they're lucky, Captain Minnie herself might just drop by to check on her crew.

Basically, the kids clubs have everything the kids could dream of – you might have a hard time getting your kiddos out of here!



Even if you don't have little ones in your group, you can usually peek inside these areas during designated open house times. Check your Navigator for times when adults are allowed to stop by and explore – outside of those windows, these spots are strictly kid-only.



EDGE AND VIBE

Vibe is the ultimate hangout for teens ages 14–17. It’s themed to be a sort of chic Parisian loft with retro-cool energy. It’s got everything teens need to live their best independent-at-sea life: TVs, music, games, and plenty of space to lounge like they own the place (because for their trip, they basically do).

For the 11–14 crowd, there’s **Edge** – a trendy New York City loft-style space with killer ocean views, endless selfie spots, and activities designed just for tweens.



“IT’S A SMALL WORLD” NURSERY!

This cozy spot is designed for the tiniest cruisers – ages **6 months to 3 years** – and offers babysitting services handled by Disney-trained counselors who can help keep the little ones happy (and parents stress-free). Kiddos can play games, do some crafts, watch movies, and more.

Note: You’ll need to book in advance for this and space is VERY limited – book as early as you can. Note that childcare here is available at an additional rate and there are cancelation policies that apply.

The **Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique** is back and ready to sprinkle pixie dust all over your kiddos (ages 3–12). Whether they want to become a princess, a pirate, or even a ship captain, the transformations here are next-level. Note that these are an additional charge not included in your cruise fare.

The Triton Lounge also makes a triumphant return, giving families a spot to team up for trivia, belt out karaoke, or just soak up some Disney-style together time.

For a relaxing spot to sip some coffee, head to **Cove Café**. It is an adults-only space with coffee, tea, and specialty drinks. At night, you'll also find cocktails, wine, and light bites.

If you're craving a smoothie, swing by **Wheezy's Freezies** for something refreshing.

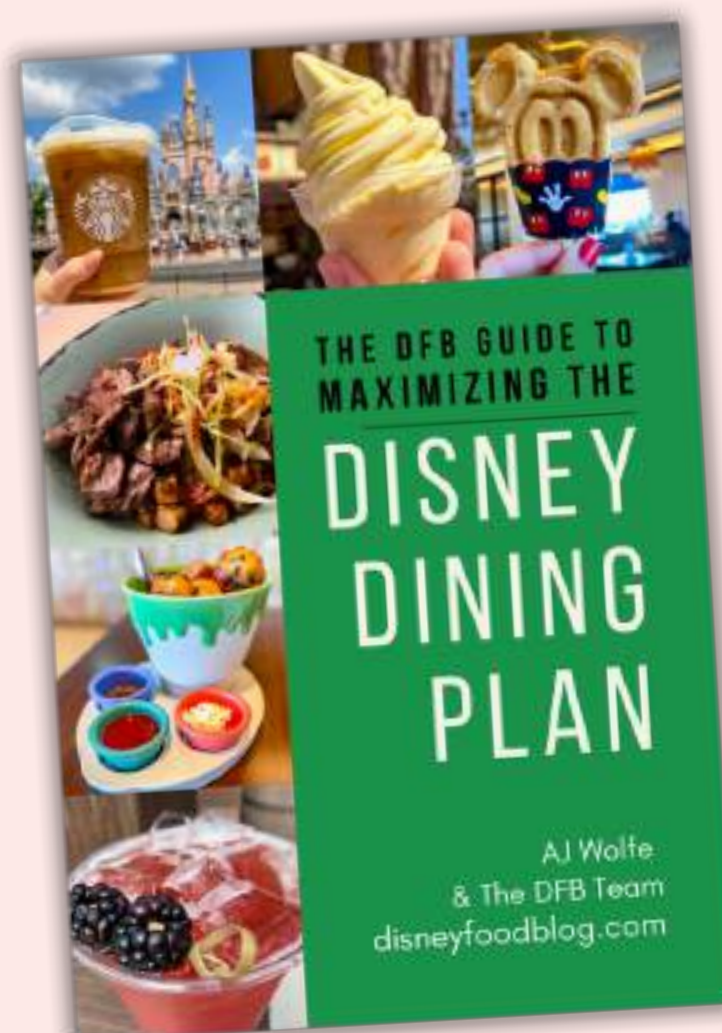
